K.'s Weekly, December 25, 1926 and was subsequently collected by Marie Smith in "The Spirit of Christmas," 1984. "Wallace Nethery was one of a group of five printers that Glen Dawson refers to as 'pioneer printers of Southern California.' In addition to publishing 25 miniature books, Nethery printed several miniature books for Dawson's Book Shop.... 

Hand-set, printed, and bound by Bela Blau. A meditation on the *Pastorela*, a popular folk drama brought to California by Spanish friars and *California* settlers, and performed at the California Missions during Christmastime. Francis J. Weber is not only a dedicated miniature book collector and publisher who has written or edited miniature books for nearly all the top miniature book publishers for the past four decades, but he is also an expert on the history of the California missions. LIMITED EDITION of 150 copies. Doris V. Welch was a publisher, collector, historian and bibliographer of miniature books. For many years, Welsh was Head of the Catalogue Department at Chicago's Newberry Library; she collected miniature books as her private passion. Having taken several classes in printing and binding at the Newberry, she decided to print miniature books of her own. This is her last miniature book, her activities restricted due to a stroke she suffered in 1965. She is remembered today for her important miniature book references, including *A Bibliography of Miniature Books (1470-1965)*. REFERENCE: Bradbury, 20th-Century U.S. Miniature Books, No. 3198.
